In summary, bring the following to the September meeting:

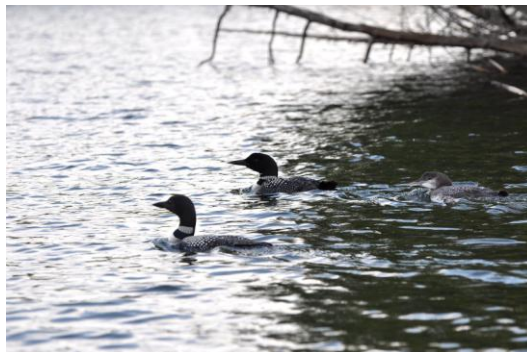
- A dish to share

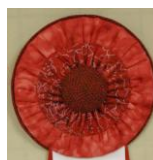

## So Many Opportunities. . . .

*Innovations in Textiles 9* is a biennial fiber celebration and features work in at least 18 venues in the greater St. Louis area. It is truly an outstanding set of exhibitions and activities. Fiber work that is new and exciting is the norm, and it is here in St. Louis and surrounding areas and most are available free of charge for the viewing. A number of shows consisting only of quilts include:

- CSQ member, Suzanne Koenen, will have a solo show at Norton's Fine Art and Framing.
- ArtFiber members Marianne Axboe, Drew Donnelly Benage, Carol Braig, Deb Lewis, Carol Neumann, and Pat Owoc will exhibit at Third Degree Glass Factory. (See page 5)
- Quilt National will be at the Foundry Art Centre. Quilt National is an internationally known biennial quilt exhibit and will include a piece by local artist Luanne Rimel.
- Art quilts will be featured at The Sheldon Art Galleries in an exhibition by members of the Fiber Art Coalition.
- Quilts will also be a part of the exhibitions at Art Saint Louis and the Missouri Fiber Artists' exhibit at the Morton J. May Gallery at Maryville University.
- Craft Alliance in the Delmar Loop will feature the work of Jim Hay. He conducts a 2-day workshop, open to all entitled "For the Love of Cloth."
- The quilted work of Edna Paterson Petty can be seen at GYA Community Gallery and Fine Craft Shop. Dawn Ottensmeier will have an exhibition "Quilted Equations" at the St. Louis Artist Guild. Other exhibitions, while not solely focused on quilts, will include fiber in a wondrous array of forms.

Many of the openings are on Friday September 16 although times do vary. Be sure to check information for each show. An in-town bus tour will be on September 17. An outlying area bus tour will be on October 1. Bus tours are \$45.00 each.

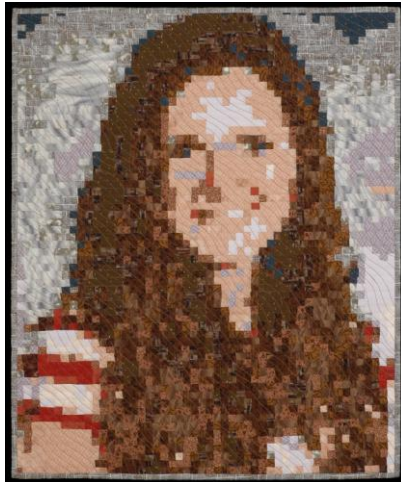

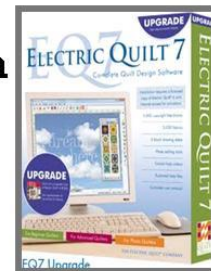

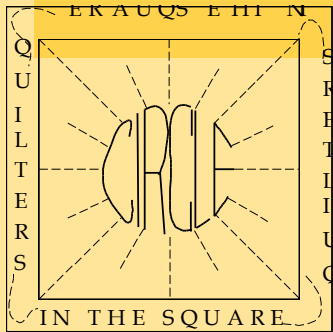
