
Quilters Giving Back: Honoring our Armed Services

Council Positions

Here are the available council positions:

- **President:** Organizes and runs general meetings and council meetings
- Vice-President: Assumes duties if President is unavailable; responsible for coordinating meeting programs/speakers
- Treasurer: Handles the bank account and the checkbook; makes bank deposits and pays bills
- Recording Secretary: Keeps minutes from Council and general meetings
- Corresponding Secretary: Handles written and email correspondence with membership
- Membership: Keeps membership records up to date; at in-person meetings keeps visitor log and sign-in table

Here are the activity positions:

- Program Chair: Assists Vice-President with arranging meeting programs/speakers
- Charity Quilts: Selects charity and organizes quilt drives for that charity
- **Website:** Keeps website information up-to-date (some tech skill handy!)
- Quintessential Quilt Show: Runs all aspects of the biennial show, with help from committee and volunteers
- Raffle Quilt: Selects pattern and fabric for biennial raffle quilt; organizes block kits for members to work on; shepherds quilt through to completion
- Newsletter: Creates bimonthly (more or less) digital newsletter for membership

Raffle Quilt Update from Joyce Johnson

Our current Dear Jane raffle quilt is being quilted by Sandy Etheridge. Betsy Sweeney will be binding all of those curvy edges, and then we will be ready to photograph it and sell the raffle tickets. Nancy Kollmar has agreed to get the quilt out in the community to help sell some of the tickets. Please be on the lookout for upcoming emails and announcements regarding these activities.

We have begun planning our next raffle quilt. The results of the online voting are in! We will be making Shakespeare in the Park, a combination of snail's trail and star blocks. The executive council discussed the options for fabric choices to differentiate it from past raffle quilts. Our tentative decision is to use the Kaffe Fassett fabric line depending upon availability. Email announcements will be sent in the coming months regarding opportunities to participate in cutting/packaging of the blocks for distribution to guild members.



CSQ Council Meeting Minutes - May 10, 2022

Attended: Carol, Joyce, Gwen, Laura, Nancy, Marilyn, Lou, Betsy, Peggy

Marilyn will become the new Program Chair. She will handle booking speakers for our meetings.

Next guild meeting in May will be at the Richmond Heights Community Center at 6:30 pm. The center has ample parking and it is easy to get in and out of the building. Sharon Wastene will do a trunk show "Inspirations." After the program, she will teach attendees how to make a folded flower.

Nancy suggested that one of the council members should be a backup person in case she (Carol) gets delayed. This falls to the vice-president.

Gwen said that she does not yet have a program for July. Betsy said that Operation Shower is willing to talk at a meeting. Setting this up for July. We will do a potluck in September.

The Richmond Heights Community Center charges extra to cover clean up expenses if we bring in food. Resident's rate to rent room is \$35/hour and we are using a guild member who lives in RH so that we can get the resident rate. We try to keep cost of speakers to under \$300. Some only charged \$200 or \$250.

Possible idea for a speaker – Invite owner of a local quilt shop to speak. How they select fabrics at the market.

Current raffle quilt. The raffle quilt is not ready yet. Gwen will talk with quilter. Our Dear Jane quilt measures 87" x 87" Discussed alternative quilters, just in case. We all agreed that simple quilting is best since the quilt is already very complex.

Next raffle quilt. Joyce will send out pictures for voting.

Carol said that she spoke with several people, and they were not interested in becoming an officer. Some people may be tired of performing the duties that they are currently doing and be willing to do another job. She suggested that we form a nominating committee to draw up a slate of officers to vote on in January. Not too early to start thinking about who to select.




