January Meeting - Tuesday, January 17 at 6:30 p.m. via Zoom

Our speaker (via Zoom) is Elizabeth DeCroos from Ontario, Canada. She will share her presentation, Pojagi – from Ancient Korea to Modern Canada. Part lecture and part trunk show, this fun talk tells her journey from Canada to Korea and back again.

Elizabeth started sewing as a child, and has always been interested in a variety of needlecrafts. In 2009, she took her young family to South Korea, where she had the opportunity to learn *pojagi* - a traditional Korean art form that goes back thousands of years. Upon returning to Canada, Elizabeth developed techniques for similar patchwork using a sewing machine and materials more readily available in the west. Her batik window hangings look like stained glass in the sun.

She works with this technique in her home base, Epida Studio. Her pattern line is called Epida Designs, and she publishes *pojagi* patterns as well as traditional quilting and embroidery patterns. She teaches live workshops, both in person and virtually, and has on-demand courses. Tutorials and inspirations at <u>epidastudio.com</u>

Carol Peck opened the meeting at 6:30 pm at Trinity Presbyterian Church in University City. Treasurer report: Paid Sandy Etheridge to quilt the raffle quilt. Balance is just under \$4,000. Time to start collecting membership renewals for 2023. \$20 each. Renew early. We have 42 members. Two guests attended tonight's demo night.

Programs. In January, we will hold a virtual meeting. Since January weather is unpredictable, a virtual meeting allows us to hold the meeting and not cancel at the last minute due to inclement weather.

Raffle quilt for 2025 quilt show. "Shakespeare in the Park" received the most votes from members. We are going to use Kaffe fabrics. There are 12" snails trails blocks and 6" star blocks. The Monday hand quilters are offering a new service: \$25 and they will baste your gorgeous quilt tops to batting and backing. You can then hand or machine quilt your quilt. No more being on your hands and knees pinning your quilt sandwich together. Proceeds will be donated to Trinity Presbyterian Church.

Tentative slate of Officers for 2023-2024 was announced.

Gwen talked about how the demonstration meeting would proceed this evening. We are fortunate to have many talented quilters in our guild. Tonight four members volunteered to demonstrate a skill.

Laura Falk demonstrated Landscape picture piecing using the technique and pattern by Cynthia England. Ruth Hanson demonstrated hand quilting techniques, using a large quilt set up on a frame. Dolores Keaton demonstrated Paper Piecing. Suzanne Marshall demonstrated how to make bias stems for Applique.

Nancy Kollmar made large scrap bags for all in attendance and encouraged us to fill them with our quilting scraps, sew up the opening when full and drop it off at the Humane Society. Thank you for encouraging us to recycle, Nancy!

After the demonstrations, we enjoyed apple cider and cinnamon/brown sugar donut holes. Yum. Everyone helped to stow chairs and tables and clean up.
