We definitely won't have time to make an entire bowl, but you'll be able to see/learn the basics and go home with at least the start of a fabric-wrapped coaster! (Or it could be a base for a larger bowl project.)

You'll see some examples, look at a variety of ways to finish off the end of the rope, and go home with a list of tips/resources. All materials will be provided, but if you would like to bring some scissors and a few straight pins, that would be helpful. Also, if you have specific fabric strips you'd like to practice with, bring those! (Strips can be $\frac{1}{2}$ " - 2".) Otherwise we'll have a variety on hand!

CSQ Guild Meeting Minutes - March 21, 2023

Welcome, Introductions and Fabric Swap (Joyce Starr Johnson)

• The meeting was held at the home of Mary. Joyce thanked Mary for opening her home to our guild and for hosting the fabric swap.

• Fabric Swap - The group drew numbers to go into the dining room (fabric room) in 5-minute increments to make their first fabric selections. After all groups had a chance, then everyone went back as they pleased.

• Joyce introduced the new members and a guest.

AMIGA Charity (Margaret K)

• Margaret K talked about the charity AMIGA (*A Mission in God's Amour*), to which some of the day's remaining fabrics and threads would be donated. This group is building a school that teaches girls in Honduras how to sew and support themselves.

• The charity is also in need of sewing machines. If you have a portable machine you can donate, they would appreciate it. Please donate by the end of March.

<u>Treasurer's Report and Membership Report</u> (Mary Carr)

- The latest bank statement shows our balance at \$3,390.00.

Charity Quilts (Lou Kauffman)

She would like to put together some kits to make some more and perhaps sew them at a meeting. Quilts made by the guild should include a guild label.

Quilt Show (Gwen Clopton)

• The University City library had a water main break and it caused damage in the basement that had just been refinished. They will not reopen until around April and will not have an elevator until August. Therefore, we are returning to our usual show time of October.

Raffle Quilt (Gwen Clopton for Nancy Kollmar)

- Nancy is getting things together for the raffle. Tickets will be available in May.
- If you are working on ribbons, have them ready by the July meeting. Many people have already completed theirs.
- Quilt blocks for the next raffle quilt are due in July. We have ten 12" Snails Trail and two paper pieced Sawtooth Star blocks that need to be adopted and completed by July. See Joyce to sign up for those.
